

## Firecats have a good night; Prevail over Macon, 53-40

Costly second half turnovers by Macon helped Florida to a 53-40 road victory Saturday night at the Macon Coliseum. The Knights loss was their second in a row to start the 2006 season. Both losses have come at home.

The Firecats garnered two of the Player of the Game awards, the Schutt Offensive Player of the Game, Chris Wallace, and the ADT Defensive Player of the Game, Quincy Sorrell.

The Firecats offense was lead by crafty veteran Chris Wallace who passed for 344 yards and six touchdowns and only one interception. Wallace's favorite target was Magic Benton who hauled in 11 catches for 163 yards and two touchdowns. The Florida offense continued to pound it out on the ground rushing for a total of 33 yards and two touchdowns. The Florida ground attack was led by Clenton Crossley who rushed for 28 yards and one touchdown.

The Firecat defense also caused four turnovers, two interceptions and two fumble recoveries. Quincy Sorrell led the Firecat defense with nine tackles and one interception. Brent Burnside also recorded an interception and five tackles.

The Knights offense put up big numbers and were led by U.S. Army Ironman of the Game James Hickenbotham. Hickenbotham caught seven passes for 96 yards and three touchdowns. He also recorded the "Cutters Catch of the Game" on the first play after the one minute warning in the first half. Quarterback Chad Elliott also threw for 340 yards and five touchdowns.

The Knights defense played well stopping the Firecats on a couple of drives but were unable to come up with the big turnover late in the game to bring the team back. Damian Purse led the way with 10.5 tackles. Leo FenceRoy once again intercepted a pass on the first drive of the game giving him two on the season.
